Cleric guilty ın sex assault

A 35-year-old Anglican Church minister has been given a suspended sentence and 30 months probation after pleading guilty to sex-

ually assaulting two young boys.

Rev. Albert Kenneth Jungers pastor of St. James the Apostle Anglican Church in Sharon, 56 kilometres (35 miles) north of Metro, yesterday pleaded guilty to the indecent assault of a 13-year-old boy last November and to the sexual assault of an 11-year-old boy last month.

A York Regional Police officer found Jungers seated on a mattress in a bush area near the reservoir, fondling the boy's genital area,

court was told.

Leave of absence

When news reports of the charge appeared, a 13-year-old boy told his parents the minister had assaulted him seven months earlier.

Defence attorney Bruce McChesney said Jungers had an enforced leave of absence since & the charges were laid and that he had voluntarily resigned his position as district chaplain of for the Boy Scouts of Canada.

McChesney said Jungers "sees himself basically as a bisexual, but does not see himself as a perlophile." He said Jungers' sexual orientation was homosexual until his marriage 13 years

"If I had to pick a background to destroy a 🔁 human being or create a criminal mind, I could not pick a better one than Mr. Jungers'," McChesney said. He explained how the Chicago-born, landed immigrant's parents had separated when he was 4, how his father had died soon after, and how his mother had become an alcoholic prostitute who remarried six times before Jungers left home at 17.

Bishop Arthur Brown testified, "we will work very hard to do everything we can to have a place for him (in the church)," and to help Junger come to terms with his problems.

PLEADS GUILTY TO FONDLING TWO BOYS

NEWMARKET — An admitted homosexual Anglican priest was given a suspended sentence yesterday and placed on 30 months probation after pleading guilty to sexually molesting two boys.

Prosecuting attorney Dee Bellamy told the court Albert Junger, 35, former parish priest in Sharon, 75 km north of Metro, had "abused his position of trust to obtain what he wanted" from the boys on two separate occasions.

"And now he is using that position to plead for a lesser sentence," she said in arguing against the defence's plea for a discharge. Bellamy agreed, however, that a jail term was not appropriate because the assaults did not involve any violence, only caresses of the boys' genitals.

Despite the conviction, Bishop-Arthur Brown said yesterday Junger won't be fired and will be transferred to another position within the church.

"We're all human and some of us have different breaking points," said Brown, adding be didn't think Junger had violated his position of trust.

'Massaged' 13-year-old

Junger's wife of 13 years sat through the proceedings reading a Bible as the father of their two children was described by character witnesses as an "outstanding priest and man" whose personality had "short circuited" through stress.

The first incident occurred Nov. 4, 1982, at an overnight camp-out at Junger's home, Bellamy said.

Junger admitted coaxing a 13-year-old boy in his charge into having a "massage" to help him sleep. The lad was part of a group of II boys and girls staying overnight.

The boy became upset when Junger rubbed his genitals so he stopped. But he crept back into the room where all the boys were sleeping and convinced the child he would sleep better in a bed instead of a couch.

The boy agreed and slept in Junger's led until he was assaulted again, when he left to rejoin his friends. He did not report the incident to his parents because he was too embarrassed.

BISEXUAL DILES! OBLIGHTON OBLIG

Junger, known as "Father Al" to his charges, was extensively involved in the Boy Scouts of Canada and several church organizations. He has since resigned those positions.

The second incident involved an 11-year-old boy whom Junger was counselling for theft. During one of their sessions he took the child to a wooded recreation area, gave him two chocolate eclairs, and on the pretext of giving a massage, assaulted the boy.

About a week later Junger again picked up the child for a counselling session and drove him to the same spot where he spread out a blanket and attempted to massage the boy's thighs.

A York Regional Police officer happened by on foot and broke up the "session." After asking questions about a suspect he was looking for, the police officer left.

A few minutes later the officer passed the area again. This time he found Junger more intimately engaged. The priest was arrested on the spot.

After news of the arrest the 13-year-old boy came forward and told police his story. An extensive investigation was launched using Junger's appointment book but no other charges materialized.

Yesterday Junger's lawyer described his client as a man who had overcome great handicaps to make himself what he is today. "His mother was an alchoholic and a prostitute," his father died at an early age," Bruce McChesney said. "He grew up in the roughest part of Chicago and was often beaten violently by any one of six stepfathers. One beating was so severe it caused him permanent brain damage."

lle said this twisted upbringing spurred Junger to study harder in an attempt to lift himself out of his sordid existence.

"He knew he wanted to be a priest at six years old." McChesney said.

'Oriented to wife'

In sessions with psychologist Dr. Ruth Bray, Junger described himself as bisexual but said he was primarily oriented to his wife.

Bray said at the time of the incidents, Junger was under great personal stress in choosing a new career as a military chaplain. The plan crumbled when he was diagnosed as having diabetes.

He wasn't happy with his work in the parish and this, coupled with other stresses, may have led to a subconscious desire to be caught and humiliated, McChesney said.

"What you have is an extremely intelligent man committing very stupid acts," he said. MS08
