Attached to my letter is a copy of the camp director's report of an incident at Yawgoog Scout Reservation with Troop 49 of Blue Point. I am also enclosing a copy of a letter sent by Jim McMann, the Scoutmaster who has met and talked with you and has taken steps to deal with the problem.

The major problem from the camp and the Council point of view is the fact that Mike Mooney, the adult leader from Troop 49, did in fact buy whiskey for an underaged staff member. In Rhode Island this is a crime and the state in recent days has been taking a very hard stand against this kind of activity.

As you can see from the report, while there are other implications to the incident, I do not believe that there was anything of a drastic nature that was committed.

At any rate, Mr. Mooney would not be welcomed back at Yawgoog Scout Reservation, and it appears from the letter from the Scoutmaster, that we will not have to worry about this in future years. You may want to alert your staff and others who would be in a "need to know" position that Mr. Mooney could be a potential problem if he is again associated with a Scout unit.

Hope all is well over on the island, and let's hope this is the end of the Mooney added to receive his on incident.

We consider our Troop to be very lucky to have the following individuals working with our Scouts. They are Tom Del Prete, Jim Hall, Todd Drumm, Mark Rosen, Mike Muniz, Mike Laria, and Lee Holst. Besides working very hard at their respective jobs, they create the environment and examples that we wish our Scouts to be exposed to at camp.

An immediate result of our week at Three Point the following things have occurred: Robert Barzilay earned the J. Harold Williams Award and is now working on staff, and five of our Scouts are now attending your C.I.T. Program.

On Friday night, 7-13-84, staff member, became ill at about 12 midnight and threw up in his cabin. On Saturday morning, eorge Egan, his key staff advisor and assistant reservation director, spoke with him. said he had been drinking and became sick. He said he went off the Reservation with an older person from another troop. George told he would speak with him further about the incident later in the day and proceeded to our regular Saturday key staff meeting. George alerted Al Mink, Reservation Director, to the problem.

After supper George Egan and Al Mink sat down with discuss the incident. Stated the following:

On Tuesday of this week, he met Mike Mooney at the Leadership Challenge rogram. They struck up an acquaintance and met him again at the leadership challenge a couple of other times during the week.

on Friday of this week met Aike Mooney again. Was at Leadership Challenge and was telling about his yob as custodian: cleaning toilets, urinals, etc. They were talking about signs that could be put up and Mike Mooney said he could put a spot on the wall with a sign that said anyone who can hit this spot could join the fire department. Said this led to the exchange of dirty jokes. Mike Mooney then invited to the campfire, Mike Mooney introduced to a couple of adult leaders and they sat for a while at the fire. After about five minutes, Mike Mooney invited to go to a package store with him and pick up some bottles. Spickup truck to the Hope Valley Liquor Store.

Mike Mooney went into the store alone and purchased two six packs of Michelob and a half pint bottle of Seagram Seven. They were parked across the street from the store in the A&P parking lot complex. When Mike Mooney returned to the truck he handed the Seagram Seven because he had asked what he wented to drink and said Seagram Seven. Began to drink the whiskey and Mike Mooney began to drink the beer. Seaid he drank part of a can of beer also and then poured some whiskey in with the rest of the beer and was drinking that. In total, said he drank about half the bottle of whiskey and one can of beer, through the remainder of the evening. The liquor was purchased at about 9:00 - 9:15 p.m. Seaid they left the parking lot and were driving around drinking. They went down Route b12 and came to a small parking lot and stopped and continued drinking.

stated that while they were driving along, Mike Mooney said he was fourteen once and he began to tell stories about sex when you are fourteen. He said: When you are lit don't you hate it when you're in school and you get a big old hard-on. He said something like: "Everybody jerks off; don't be ashamed of it." He asked if he ever experimented sexually with other boys and he said no. said Mike Mooney did not believe this. He says that before Mike Mooney asked him about his sexual activities, Mooney said he was a

bi-sexual.

Well, I'm not."

stated: "I kad drum quite a bit by this time and I don't remember everything he was saying with his exact words but it became obvious to me that he was trying to lead me into a mutual masturbation session. He told me he had a hard-on and I said to him: "Then why don't you go have a pud pulling session." He said: "Let's do that." He thought I meant both of us, but I meant for him to do it alone.

I mentioned to him that I felt I was getting drunk and might be losing my coordination. He then reached over and put his hand on my genttal area and said "How's that coordination." I pushed his hand away.

He told me he was not a very forceful person and I felt he would not try to force himself on me physically but he was trying to push me psychologically. He asked me why I didn't want to do anything with him sexually. I told him I had morals. He said well you're smoking and drinking, why not this?

When he realized he wasn't going to get anywhere with me he decided to me back to camp. He said at one point: "I should wate taken with me from the troop. He might have done something with me" - or words to that effect. (Note: Later, in checking this statement with he stated that he was not that sure that the boy mentioned by Mike Mooney was

On the way back to camp, says Mike Mooney continued to try to have him do something sexual with him and they kept "arguing about it". The truck was panked in the Boden Parking of at Yawgoog, they got out of the truck, and he made a last affort to get to do something. After a few minutes, he had to get going and he went to his cabin. When he got into the cabin he became ill and threw up.

After receiving this information from Indicated three Point where Troop Egan to call Tom DelPrete, camp director at three Point where Troop 49 Blue Point is camping this week, and get an evaluation of the adult leadership. Tom DelPrete indicated they were very responsible and ran a fine troop. I then had George meet with Tom DelPrete and the Scoutmaster, James McMann, to share the above statement with them and to have the Scoutmaster come to my office to discuss the matter. The SM requested that he also have Clif McCsllum, ASM, at tend the conference and the request was honored. While George was at Three Point I called to my office to review carefully the statement he had made. Indicated to me that the notes I had typed were correct in terms of what had happened.

I then met with the SM, James McMann, the ASM (actually I believe he is the troop committee chairman) George Egan. I shared statement with them. I indicated that my next step was to report this matter to our Scout Executive who would advise me regarding action to be taken. Mr. Borrelli, Scout Executive directed that the parent be called and informed of statement. If she preferred charges, I was directed to sall the State Police. If she did not prefer charges, I was to inform her that Mr. Borrelli would transmit my report of this incident to the Scout Executive of Suffolk County, Long Island, MY., and that it would be dealt with by that Scout Executive.
